To better serve our customers, we have designed a user-friendly app and also operate a 24/7 call centre. We have already garnered positive feedback from users. As the newest EV Charging Point Operator in Singapore, we are ready to support the country's goal to convert the entire vehicle population to electric. ChargeCo is making good progress in the deployment of EV chargers under this large-scale tender. We have started work at another 15 HDB carparks. Working closely with LTA, EV^e, HDB, PUB and our vendors, we are on track to deploy our EV chargers across 108 locations by end 2023."

ChargeCo is a collaboration between Strides and YTL PowerSeraya for the decarbonisation of land transport in Singapore. The joint venture aims to install, operate and maintain electric vehicle (EV) chargers, as well as provide other EV charging services. The two equity partners of ChargeEco, Strides and YTL PowerSeraya, together with Airetec and Yes Energy formed a consortium that won the tender from LTA to build charging points at HDB carparks in the Central and East regions of Singapore. In order to bring convenient EV charging to heartland residents as soon as possible, the ChargeEco team started work immediately after the tender was awarded.

Under the tender, ChargeEco will be providing EV charging services at a total of 364 HDB carparks, and the EV chargers are expected to be completed by mid-2025.

Jason, a Telok Blangah resident who has started using ChargeEco's chargers regularly, said: "I am glad that EV chargers are being installed in HDB carparks, making home charging possible even for EV owners living in public housing. After trying ChargeEco's chargers, I find them easy to use and highly reliable. The ChargeEco app is also well-designed and user-friendly. The support team is also responsive and continuously working on improving its app, making the overall charging experience pleasant and fuss-free."
